Theoretical classes are held in classrooms equipped with computers and projectors, while practical training takes place in a service training classroom, two culinary training classrooms, one classroom for travel agency and hotel operations, and one accounting classroom. The school has a restaurant on Zlatibor, which is used both for student practice and for commercial purposes. Students complete their practical training in business establishments such as hotels, restaurants, and travel agencies in Zlatibor and Užice.
