WORKSHOPS ON EARLY SCHOOL LEAVING PREVENTION START IN KNJAŽEVAC, BELA PALANKA AND PROKUPLJE UNDER RECI PROJECT

The action Pre and elementary schooling of Roma: fostering opportunities for greater attainment and early school leaving reduction (RECI) is funded by the European Union and implemented by the World Vision Austria led consortium of partners including Agroinvest Foundation Serbia, Western Balkans Institute, Preschool Teacher Training College "Mihailo Palov" Vršac, Cultural Information Center "Pralipe" Pirot with the support of the Ministry of Labour, Employment, Veteran and Social Affairs as the main beneficiary of the project. This action is part of the project European Union Support to Inclusive Society, supported by the European Union with a grant fund of 4.331.275,56 million euro and managed by the Delegation of the European Union to the Republic of Serbia

RECI project was created with the idea to contribute to increased Roma children attainment in pre-school education as well as to decrease Roma students' early school leaving in elementary schools.

The first workshop on early school leaving (ESL) prevention will take place in Knjaževac on June 6 at 11 a.m, in the premises of elementary school Vuk Karadžić; in Bela Planaka, Crvena Reka, on June 7 at 10 a.m. in the premises of elementary school Jovan Arandžević; and in Prokuplje on June 8 at 10 a.m, in the premises of elementary school Milić Rakić Mirko.

Workshop participants are elementary schools staff, including directors and pedagogists, Centers for Social Work, Local Youth Offices and local NGO partners.

During the first workshop, participants will discuss and agree on mechanisms of ESL prevention they will be implementing in the local context during the academic year 2016/2017, and in particular through (peer) tutoring program and strategy on set up early warning mechanism for youth at risk of ESL. Peer tutoring program will connect 45 selected tutors to work with 45 tutees at risk of ESL.

The second workshop will follow in early September with the focus on concrete steps and action plan for implementation of the program at elementary schools. Both workshops would result in fostered inter sectoral cooperation at local level in the area of Roma education and ESL.
